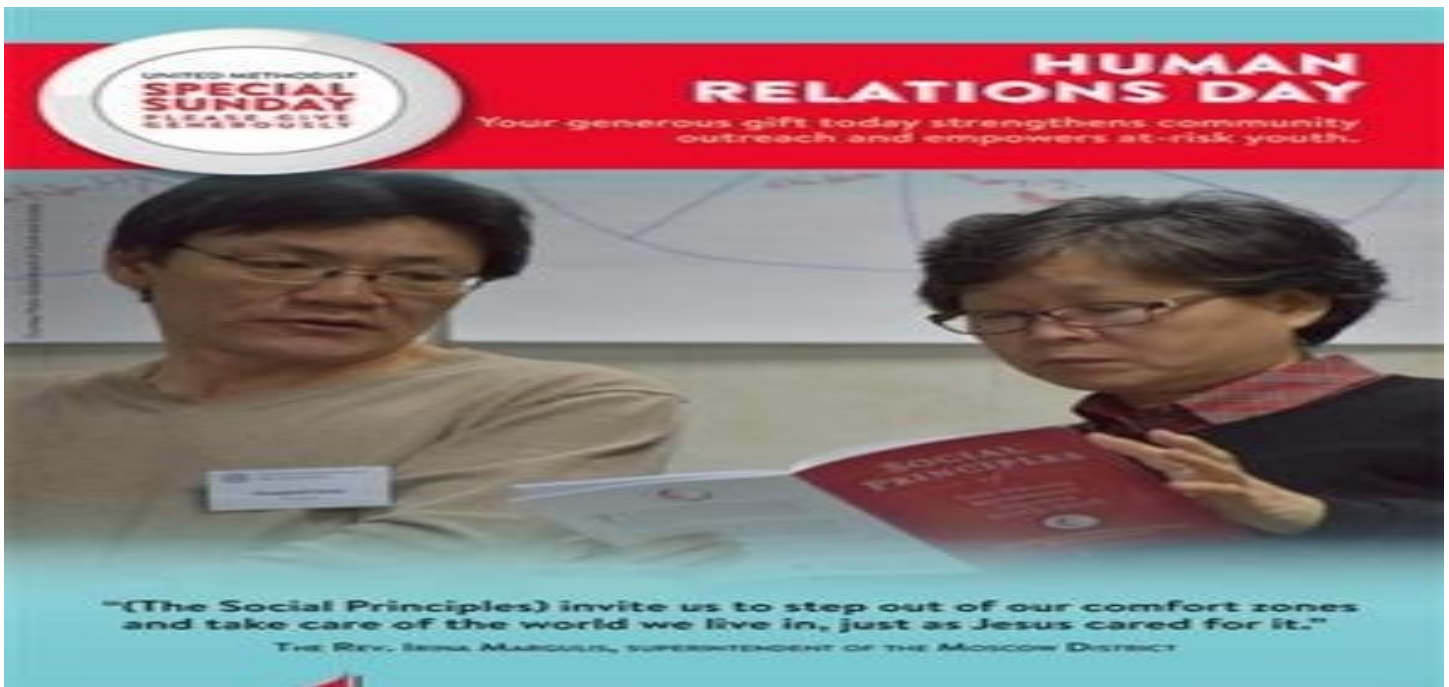

### Human Relations Day Offering: January 21, 2018

This offering supports the United Methodist Community Developers Program, United Methodist Voluntary Service and Youth Offender Rehabilitation programs. Below are 2 examples of how the offering has been used to make a difference for members of God's family.

The home of Emma Wooten, 85 was in dire need of repair. It was impossible for her to accomplish the repairs alone. She had tried to insulate her water damaged home with cereal boxes. The ceilings buckled under a leaky roof and the wiring was unsafe.

Thanks to a United Methodist Partners in mission (PMI) team, Emma's prayers for help to repair her house were answered.

The PMI program focuses on urgent home repairs, an after-school program for at-risk children and youth, and a resource referral center for families in the area. A community garden provides fresh, healthy food for people of all ages.

When "Donna" an active participant in her local UM Church in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, became pregnant as a teen, she found herself enfolded in a Blanket of Love, a Christ-centered ministry working to improve birth outcomes of African-American babies by teaching prenatal care, infant care and parenting skills to young pregnant African-American women and their families. Director, Julia Means, says, "The first thing I teach them is - as a mother - you must teach them to pray. Children need to be brought up in the church."
